COMPLETE PLANS TO BE SUB- MITTED IN TWO WEEKS.

At the alumni meeting held immediately after the banquet, Saturday evening, October 21, definite plans for the construction of a new home for Chi Zeta were laid. According to the announcement made by the committee placed in charge of the financial plan, every effort will be extended to have work start on the new house by spring and that if present plans successfully materialize the house should be ready for occupancy by September 1, 1923.

The meeting which was called to order by Brother Hart, president of the alumni organization, was an open forum with all members participating in the discussions. As a measure of expediency Brother Hart appointed two general committees which were to embrace the entire membership of both the Chicago and St. Louis alumni organizations. Brother Krupka was appointed chairman of the Chicago committee and Brother Cullinane of the St. Louis group. It was also decided at this time to appoint Brother Crow of Springfield legal advisor, for the project. The matter of arranging for the financing of the scheme has been placed in the hands of Brother Krupka, while that of construction and accounting has been given into the hands of Brothers Cullanane and Tower respectively.

The financial scheme to date is one which will necessitate the co-operation of the Dads, to whom the tentative building policy will be outlined on the week-end of November 4th.
