The spring semester of 1991 has arrived, bringing with it many exciting challenges and opportunities for Chi Zeta.

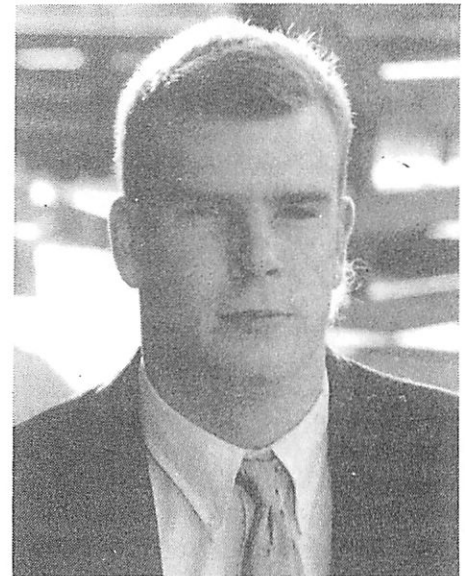

Chi Plays Hardball at U of I

A new tradition for the men of Chi Zeta was born last fall when the zeta unveiled its new 10-team hardball invitational at the University of Illinois; a tournament which will be an annual event. Many of the brothers were tired of playing the usual softball, so we started our own baseball tournament.

The games of the first outing of the invitational were held at Champaign Centennial's Burt Seamen Field throughout a weekend. Koala Mineral Spring Water sponsored the event, which ended up raising more than \$400 for the Child Crisis Nursery Center for Champaign-area abused children. This money was used by the center to buy equipment it had needed to help the children.

Overall, the tournament was a great success, but it was not as huge a success as the Lambda Chis had hoped — we had earned only a third-place finish in the first tournament due to a nail-biting loss to the Delts. The Delts became the eventual champions of the tournament. We already see great promise for the second annual Lambda Chi Hardball Invitational, which will take place next fall. This is one philanthropic undertaking which has the entire campus stirring.

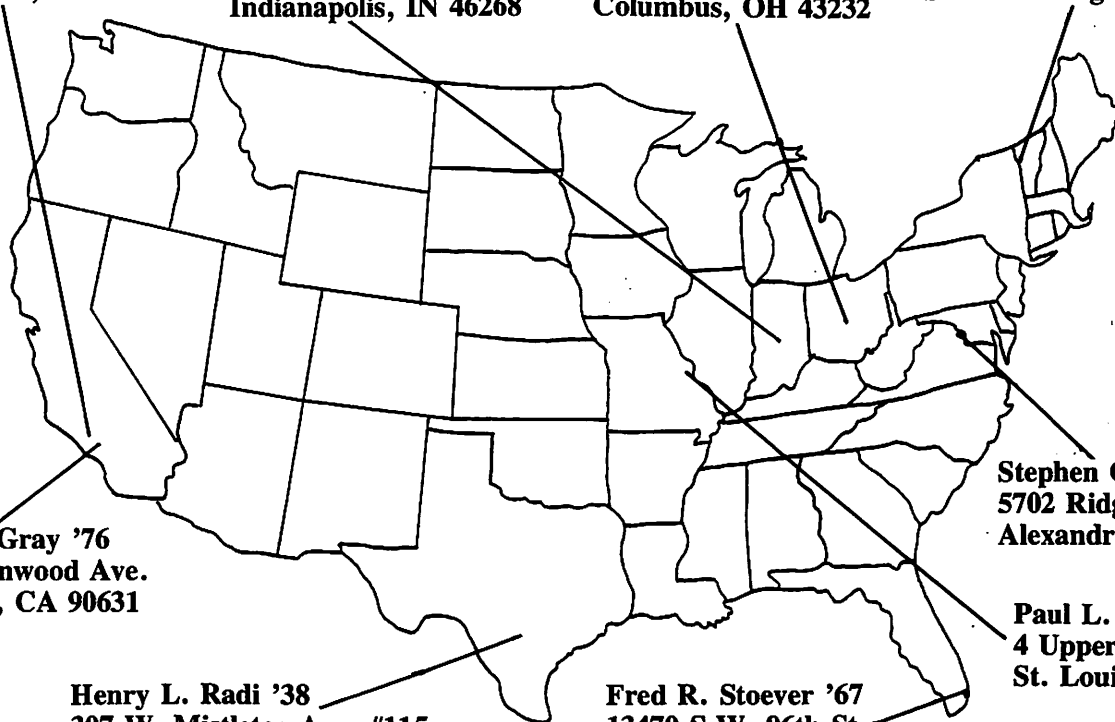
